We added two more outstanding volunteers this year to the dedicated bunch that keeps Rotary Lights moving along. Steve Klankowski and Mike Fell have logged numerous hours performing a host of duties. We are fortunate to have them involved.

Clubs from West Salem, Holmen, Central, Logan, and Aquinas packed over 52,000 meals for South America while collecting over 30,000 non-perishable food items to help stock the shelves of the Hunger Task Force. 
Henry "Hank" Fillner

When you gaze at the 120-foot lighted Christmas tree that serves as the Rotary Lights beacon, think of Henry "Hank" Fillner, who passed away last May at age 86. Hank was a fixture at the park, overseeing the tree's installation and caring for the reindeer. He leaves a legacy of community service, kindness, and a dedication to helping others that went far beyond the norm.

You might say Hank was on top of it all at Rotary Lights because for years he could be found up in the crane putting the topper on the tree. During the Rotary Lights season, Hank was at the park daily, even when he wasn't supposed to be, say his daughters, Dina Blummer and Lyne Motylinki. "At a certain point, Mom told him he wasn't supposed to go up in the lift truck anymore. We'd find him there anywhere and he'd say 'don't tell her'." Twice a day, Hank cared for the reindeer, making sure the animals had everything they needed. A quiet, unassuming man, Hank never overlooked an opportunity to help someone.

Raised in La Crosse, one of five children, and attending Aquinas High School, Hank spent most of his career at Pappenfus Electric. His concern for others was evident early on, as he hired out to farms to help pay his sisters' tuition.Hank never sought the limelight. He was a behind-the-scenes type of guy, pitching in wherever and whenever help was required, setting the needs of others before his own and expecting nothing in return.

Lyne and Dina describe their dad as an outdoors man who loved the river, building a home along the Mississippi, and spreading that love to his daughters. "Under Dad's watchful eyes, we learned to hunt, fish, boat, and waterski." But his parenting went beyond that. As young girls on the Blue Star Color Guard, "Dad would drive the equipment for the whole squad to different events, finding a trailer and hauling it for them.



He and Mom were members of the first Blue Star parent organization."

Hank's contributions span a lifetime. "At least fifty years ago," say his daughters, he became involved with the American Legion, despite not being a veteran. "He worked with the rifles with the honor squad." That transitioned into his becoming one of the head cooks at the SOS breakfast. Because of Hank's dedication, he was named an honorary member. This year's first SOS breakfast was dedicated to him and his portrait "hangs in their hall with the honor guards' plaques."

The list goes on and on, Lyne and Dina recall. "He spent countless hours with friends and neighbors with health issues, being there to talk and listen. If he took someone under his wing, he helped them for years. He was a thoughtful listener; he somehow made it happen if someone needed something

done," often before that person realized they needed help. Hank kept an eye on sick or elderly neighbors, checking in with them, assisting them in any way he could.

When Hank's wife Patricia took ill, eventually requiring nursing home care, he visited her twice daily, at breakfast and dinner. "Even after she passed three years ago," said Lyne and Dina, "he'd take flowers to the nurses because of the friendship he established."


Dina and Lyne knew they could find their dad at Rotary Lights in the late fall months. "We'd visit and Dad always said 'that's where I'm going to be during the day'." Though no longer able to ride the lift truck, Hank still made daily trips to the park. He considered his Rotary Lights fellow volunteers as family. "We stayed in close contact with all these people and share memories."

Hank was a loving husband and father. "What a legacy he's left. He showed us how to be a parent in a loving way. We felt supported, knew he loved us, and always knew they (Mom and Dad) were behind us."

Hank died doing what he did besthelping others, but not wanting to be noticed for it. While tilling the garden at Bethany Nursing Home, the tractor tipped, ending the life of a man whose legacy will go on forever. As for the words about him in this brochure, say Lyne and Dian, "Dad would be humbled and overwhelmed, but honored."

So think of Hank when you look up at the entrance tree; think of him when you visit the reindeer; but, most of all, when you wonder if you should help someone, think of Hank. That's what he would want the most.
